The delivery of the film with the support of lighting, stories, and characters that have their own characteristics add to the impression of this film. The parasite film, which is the work of Bong Joon-ho and Han Ji-won, is one of the best Korean films that won Best Original Screenplay at the 2020 Oscars. Bong Joon-ho has previously had several films. His famous film works including Memories of

Murder, The Host, Snowpiercer, Okja, and Parasite. In his films, he often uses styles or genres such as action, dark comedy, crime, monster drama, and thrillers.

This film became the first South Korean film to winPalme d'Or. The film was later released in South Korea byCJ Entertainmenton 30 May 2019 with a duration of 2 hours 12 minutes. The film received tremendous positive criticism, and is often hailed as one of the greatest South Korean films of all time, as well as one of the best films of the 2010s decade. With a gross of over 160 million US dollars worldwide, it is also one of the most commercially successful films in South Korea. Over more than 180 awards received, Parasite has won four awards in92nd Academy Awards, includingBest Movies,Best Director,Best Original Screenplay, andBest International Film. It is the first South Korean film to be nominated for an Academy Award, as is the first non-English language film to win Best Picture. In77th Golden Globe Awards, this movie wonBest Foreign Language Films. The film also received four nominations in73rd British Academy Film Awards, by winningBest Films Not in EnglishandBest Original Screenplay. It also became the first non-English language film to winScreen Actors Guild Award for Outstanding Actor in a Film category. InGrand Bell Awards56th, Parasite garnered eleven leading nominations with five wins.

This film presents an interesting and unique story. The development of the theme carried out in this film is about life that occurs in South Korea, especially the socioeconomic life between the rich and the poor which results in social inequality in society. This film has a new color because it can show examples of life that often occur but cause contra of these events. Films with a theme like this can often be said to occur on the border between the economic life of the rich and the poor, but the film parasite is able to wrap the story successfully so that it can get ratings and awards for the appearance of the story and its cool characters. This spectacular work focuses on a family of four unemployed people with a bleak future. One day, Ki-woo, The eldest son in the family was recommended by a friend who is a student from a prestigious university to become a high-paid tutor. One of the main attractions of this film is how Bong Joon-ho can tell something so simple, by providing such heavy suspense and intensity. Unlike other thriller films that sell a spooky and gripping aura, Bong Joon-ho makes Parasite like a family film. The setting is made at home, we can see the daily life of a family like normal people in detail, only the routines of each family member. Boong Joon-ho is really good at making story suspenses. He did not give it directly to the audience. Everything is carried slowly.

Basically, the intensity of the story of this film is built like playing hide and seek. We are shown how the 'parasite' family clashes with the 'host' family, but with their lives at stake. This is what makes this Parasite film have a unique 'smell' of tension, by showing how slim the chances are that they can escape from the 'host' family. The intensity of the story even continues to be added throughout the story, by creating a branching conflict that makes the audience unable to focus on just one problem. This is the attraction of the Parasite film, namely the conflict presentation that is shown very realistically. Initially, the audience focuses on a simple conflict, preventing the 'host' family from learning the secrets of the 'parasite' family. Then came the second conflict, how the 'parasite' family must deal with the 'secret' family. There comes another conflict of hide and seek, conflict of identity, so that the conflict ends in a climax. On the pretext that his son's artistic potential must be developed, Ki Woo suggests hiring an art teacher named Jessica. When in fact Jessica is Ki Woo's sister, namely Ki Jeong. Then after being hired, Ki Jeong devises a plan to get driver Park fired and replaced with his father, namely Ki Taek. Ki Taek successfully works as a family driver, while her mother, Choong Sook, is a housemaid. One day Park went camping in the countryside. Ki Taek and his family take advantage of the opportunity to take advantage of the house's facilities and host the night away, doing whatever they want when the employer leaves them.

Unexpectedly, in the middle of the heavy rain, someone rang the doorbell. He is Moon Gwang. With his clothes and hair tousled, the former housekeeper of the Park Family asks to come in. He half pushes and is finally allowed in by Chung Sook. Upon entering, Moon Gwang then opened the basement, shifted the cupboard containing a collection of wine and drinks and entered the hidden room behind the cupboard. Chung Sook, who followed him, was certainly surprised. In the basement it turns out that Moon Gwang's husband lives. He had lived there for many years escaping from loan sharks. The other members of the Kim family who followed the two women secretly, all the way to the basement were no less surprised. They even fell into that dungeon, and makes Moon Gwang realize that this family has conspired to deceive the Park Family. In the midst of the struggles of the Kim and Moon Gwang families, the Parks report that they are returning ahead of schedule and tell Chung Sook to make instant noodles to eat on their way home. So that made the Kim family panic. Long story short, the Kim family was finally forced to return to their home in the basement apartment in the rain.

When they got home, they found their slum house had been flooded. Efforts to remove water from the house are also in vain, their house is in the basement. Finally that night they were forced to stay at the refugee camp. Meanwhile, at the Park Family's house which is located in an elite area, a garden party is being planned to celebrate Da Song's birthday. The entire Kim Family was invited of course. Ki Taek and his wife even get busy because they have to prepare all the party needs. Unexpectedly the party had to end tragically after Moon Gwang's husband who managed to get out of the basement disrupted the party. He stabs Ki Jung to death and hits Ki Woo on the head with a rock. In the chaos Da Song fainted. The panicked Mr. Park yells at Ki Taek to immediately take Da Song to the hospital. Ki Taek, who is still in shock to see his daughter killed, turns dark and finally stabs Mr. Park to death. He also ran away. The ending of this story is heartbreaking, the Kim family is left with Ki Woo and his mother who continue to look for Ki Taek. Since running away, Ki Taek has indeed disappeared into the earth. No one knows of its existence.

The discussion of the first session which is about the life of social inequality can be in the form of several things as follows, the first representation regarding the impact of the education gap is that it is difficult to enter a university, not only a matter of cost but also having to compete with thousands of other prospective students who have the same dream. In Korea, the success of a child entering a top university is a great pride for the family. Therefore, parents are willing to spend a lot of money to prepare their children for university entrance exams, even from the age of toddlers. Ki-woo, who comes from a lower-class family, cannot continue his education at the college level due to being hindered by the family's economy, as a result, Ki-Woo is also unable to pay for private tutors. Ki-Woo is different from his friend Min Hyuk, who can continue his education. From this scene, it can be seen that there is a gap between those born to rich families and those born to poor families. Ki-woo who was born from a poor family is not able to compete not because he is not smart but he is unable to compete with children from rich families who have received expensive and quality education since childhood.

The country of South Korea is known to have an excellent education system, in fact many schools and universities provide facilities to educational programs to support the competence of their students. The role of parents in Korea is very strict on the education of their children. Parents want their children to focus and be diligent in education from a young age, and even get achievements as the best students. Not infrequently they are willing to enroll their children in various learning academies such as tutoring centers, piano courses, taekwondo training, and many more, but there are also parents who are unable to enroll their children in various learning academies due to lack of funds. The second representation is about the impact of inequality in the neighborhood. South Korea as the country with the fourth largest economy in Asia is not immune from the development gap in the city. Behind the glittering skyscrapers, lies a slum neighborhood with uninhabitable houses. The gap in living environment is illustrated visually in the film Parasite. Family Park lives in a clean, well-maintained, comfortable and elite environment. Meanwhile, the Kim family lives in a slum, poorly lit, unfit, cramped and unhealthy environment. In the scene for the Park Family residence, it is clear that the state of the house looks luxurious and neat. It has decent facilities to live in, the place feels calm and comfortable, even people who visit are amazed at the state of the house. A depiction of the state of the house of a rich family that is quite large and has a fairly large grass field. a rich family who has a special room containing clothes and other neatly arranged accessories. The Parks also have a basement to use during emergencies. While the Kim Family's residence is very different from the Park Family's, they occupy a semi-basement building as a place to live. The situation there is very uncomfortable, even the windows of the house are parallel to the road so that a lot of dust and dirt can enter the house. The toilet area used is very narrow even when using the toilet it looks like it is uncomfortable. In the film scene when a flood occurs which makes the Kim family's house submerged and cannot carry their belongings, they only get clothes from other people's donations.

The third representation is about the impactopportunity gap. The scene in the film, Mr. Park emphasizes that he really does not like people who cross the line. The phrase "crossing the line" mentioned by Mr. Park is a sentence that is very commonly used in Korean society. The meaning of a person who crosses the line is a person who says, behaves, and behaves inappropriately. For example, a subordinate suddenly said something to his boss who was patronizing. Another example in South Korea is that there are two ways of speaking, namely formal and informal. Informal speaking is only allowed to people who already know each other who were born in the same year or people who are younger than him. When speaking informally to an older person even if it's only a year apart, it would be considered rude and 'crossed the line'. In the past, people who were educated and came from rich families or called Yangban got all the services. Little people don't even have the right to have names. They cannot refuse anything that is ordered to them. If they crossed the line, they would be killed just like that. The country's caste system is inherited from their ancestors. Rich people who live in a clean environment, away from bacteria, and houses with the best air circulation clearly have different body odors from families who inhabit the semi-basement, inadequate air circulation, the position of the toilet is higher than the floor of the house, lots of insects, and a really shabby environment.

In the film, the smell is a representation of poverty as if to say that no matter how much they try to live like the rich they still can't get rid of their poor status. The smell of poverty continues to stick with them as an identity.

The scene of heavy rain that makes the slum area where the Kim family lives is flooded. Every picture in the scene shows water flowing from top to bottom. When Kiwoo stops at one of the steps and looks at his feet under the water, Ki-woo seems to look inside himself and realizes that he and his family can't seem to fight their destiny as poor people. This shows that no matter how hard they try, the poor will remain poor. They will not be able to fight their destiny as people born poor. Another scene that shows the gap of opportunity is the many attempts that have been made by Mr. Kim, but none of them have succeeded. Until finally it made Mr. Kim believe that people like them (from the lower classes) shouldn't plan, because whatever is planned never goes as planned. The discussion of the second session is about the moral message that we can take in the parasite film as follows:

The first representation of the moral message is, be careful to put trust in others. Some of us may have trust issues so it is not easy to trust others. Usually, trust issues are caused by bad experiences in trusting others. So it is very natural that Mr. Park's family has trust issues and it is difficult to trust others. Unfortunately, Mr. Park's family is so easy to deceive and put their trust in the wrong people. It can be seen from the scene when Ki-Woo recommended to the Park Family that a friend could be introduced to work at the Park Family's house, but that trust was abused by Ki-Woo's family who then took over the entire house in a short time.

The representation of the second moral message is, nothing is instant for good results. In this film, the son of Kim Ki Taek, Ki Woo, gets the opportunity to change his life when he is given a job by his friend, Min Hyuk, who will study abroad. The job given is to be an English tutor for a daughter from a rich family, the Park family. But unfortunately, Ki Woo does everything he can to get his family in to be accepted to work in the house. It all started when he decided to trick the park family by recommending his younger brother Kim Ki-jeong and faking his sister's background. After Kim Ki-jeong was accepted, he recommended his own father as a driver. Then his father recommended his wife as a housemaid in the Park family. As time went on, he started covering lies with

lies just to get a lot of money instantly. Finally, he and his family were exposed to their own sap. The representation of the third moral message, namely, Mature Financial Planning. The trouble that hit Kim Ki Taek's family was the background for everything they did in the film Parasite. Their lives are so difficult, they and their families have to live in poverty, living in a basement house and earning irregular income. So, when there is a way to make their life better, even if the method is not right, they still do it without fear. Before, they finally regretted their actions.

The representation of the fourth moral message is that everything we do always has consequences and rewards. In this film, it is clear that the actions of the parasitic family are certainly wrong, but they still do it. Therefore, what they have done of course they will get the impact for the actions they have done. The impact they got for their actions, namely, their family was destroyed and caused their daughter, Kim Ki-jeong to die. The representation of the fifth moral message is, be honest in life even though the reality is so bitter. In the story of the film parisite, it shows that it was the circumstances that made the Kim family commit dishonest acts. They cannot accept the truth, that their family has a low income. It can be seen from the scene where the Kim family only works as a service for folding pizza boxes. They end up doing everything they can to get a job, by committing dishonest acts.

CONCLUSION

After doing research on the scenes in the film Parasite using qualitative and quantitative methods, the writer concludes that Parasite Film represents social inequality in South Korea which is presented in audio and visual through scenes, settings and dialogues. The fourth moral message is displayed through denotative, connotative and mythical meanings, namely, everything we do always has consequences and rewards. In South Korean culture that causes each individual to receive a reward according to his actions. The representation of the fifth moral message is, be honest in life even though the reality is so bitter. Honesty is an act that should be used as an example in everyday life. Honesty means the conformity of attitude between words and deeds. Honesty also means saying what it is according to reality. In this film, conveying a moral message related to honesty is the most important thing in carrying out a good life for oneself, in family, work and the environment.

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
